This year's message focuses on the Nativity and why a display of the Nativity should be the center piece of your Christmas decorations and not be put in some corner of a room. It is well to note that it is uniquely in prominence in all of our Churches all over the world during this Christmas Season. But there is more to the display of the nativity than the obvious birth of Jesus. There is the significance of baby Jesus opening His arms and welcoming us and I will address this later in my message. What is missing in our conversations is the fact that this King's Kingdom, in His own words, is not of this world. So what does this baby really represent to us Christians and why do I ask that it be the center piece of your Christmas Celebration? And how better to start a new beginning than with a new beautiful baby Jesus. Jesus Christ's life on this earth is our story, "The Greatest Story Ever Told". We know what this Baby will become. He will become "The Teacher", our Teacher. His lessons have not changed nor have they been diminished nor compromised. They are the way of the Truth that Jesus came to testify to. We need to just follow His Lessons, nothing else. Mindful that in our time, we are only in the first few chapters of God's new book, but all our answers on how to live a life as to be able to enter into the Kingdom of God, have been written in the first chapter of God's new book.
